***PLUM COULEE DECEMBER 2025 POLICE ACTIVITY***

***HIGHLIGHTS***

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of December Police were called to the Plum Coulee CO OP Gas bar, for a gas drive off. Employees felt that it may have been an accidental incident. Police made contact with the registered owner of the vehicle, and they advised it was a mistake, and they attended to the CO OP and cleared the amount owing.

On the 15<sup>th</sup> of December Police were called to an address in Plum Coulee, where a vehicle window had been broken. There were no signs of the incident being criminal in nature. It should be noted, Police had a similar incident in Altona, which was caught on video, on the 14<sup>th</sup> of December. Rhineland car advised it is rare, but has happened, where a window, which has a crack, may shatter later on when its cold, and heat is applied to it.

On the 16<sup>th</sup> of December Police received a call from the Ankle Bracelet Monitoring office, advising that a person on court order to wear a ankle bracelet, has breach his condition, and is away from his residence. Police also received a call from a Plum Coulee resident, who is on a ankle bracelet, who advised his dog just ran off the yard, and he chased after it to retrieve the dog. He was off his property for a couple of minutes. No charges laid in this incident.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of December Police received a complaint from the Garden Valley School Division in relation to a motorist passing a school bus while loading/unloading in Plum Coulee. A license plate number was provided, and the registered owner of the vehicle was charged with this offence.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of December Police were called to a single motor vehicle collision in Plum Coulee. Due to a winter storm, Police were making slow progress, and contacted Plum Coulee Fire. Fire advised that they were on scene, and there were no injuries, and that the fire department assisted in removing the vehicle from the roadway, due to limited visibility. Vehicle to be towed after blizzard conditions end.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of December, during a snow storm, RCMP requested Altona Police attempt to locate a stranded motorist on highway 201 a few miles west of Altona. Parents were

attempting to meet an east bound ambulance, so their infant could be transferred to Boundary Trails Hospital. The east bound ambulance was unable to attend the location as well, due to numerous stuck vehicles blocking the highway. Police located the vehicle and all occupants were transported back to Altona Hospital.
